Flu Vaccine Requirements for Staff and Visitors

The Government requirement for staff and visitors to have provided proof of a flu vaccination comes into effect on the 1st June 2021. While our staff have been vaccinated, it is time to ensure that all visitors provide proof of a 2021 vaccination before they enter either The House of Saint Hilarion or Villa Saint Hilarion before the 1st June 2021. Proof can be in the form of a statement or record from your health practitioner; or an immunisation history statement available from Medicare online or the Express Plus Medicare mobile app. Proof of vaccination can be emailed to admin@sainthilarion.asn.au or handed to either reception desk during office hours.


Update to COVID Vaccine Rollout

People living at The House of Saint Hilarion were provided with an opportunity to receive the first dose of the pfizer vaccine on the 10th April and will receive the second dose on the 13th May 2021. Unfortunately, the date scheduled for the first COVID vaccine at the Villa was cancelled. Please be assured we continue to constantly follow up with the Commonwealth to ensure this is rescheduled as soon as possible.

While having a COVID vaccine will help to reduce the likelihood of acquiring COVID-19, it is not a total guarantee. Therefore, we would like to remind visitors to stay away if you or someone you live with:

- Has symptoms of COVID-19, or
- Has been required to isolate for any reason.

We are delighted to welcome relatives, representatives and friends back to our Resident and Relatives meeting from May 2021. The next meetings are scheduled for:


